Microsoft and Partners Collaborate to Support Our Local Communities

Together, Microsoft and our Partners can have a significant impact on communities by enabling NGOs to provide skills training.

Over the past few months, the International Association of Microsoft Certified Partners (IAMCP) and members of the Microsoft Community Affairs team have laid the foundation for a program to enable the non-profit community around the world, ultimately benefitting millions of people.

Many companies have community programs that include employee volunteerism, product or service donation and cash contributions to specific causes. While these programs bring great benefits to the community, we can do more together. Through relationships with Microsoft grantees, we can ensure that resources are maximized. The pilot activities below are examples of such engagements:

India - This project will support HelpAge India, a Microsoft strategic software grant recipient serving 1.5M elderly in India. IAMCP member Techgyan will provide support to carry out the technology plan for HelpAge, including deployment of SharePoint, InfoPath, SQL Server and Exchange Server, as well as related staff training.

Puerto Rico – Two projects will support existing Community Technology Skills grantees. IAMCP members Rock Solid Technologies and Nagnoi are making staff available to train people at the community centers in IT and business management.
